

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Product Positioning

The HUAWEI IdeaHub series (for short referred to as IdeaHub) is a range of smart endpoints that integrate smart writing, ultra-HD projection, video conferencing, and open office applications. The IdeaHub can meet the smart office requirements in various scenarios, such as enterprise conference rooms, manager rooms, open office areas, and home study rooms.

There are four IdeaHub models, namely, IdeaHub Pro 65, IdeaHub Pro 86, IdeaHub S 65, and IdeaHub S 86. **Table 1-1** lists the differences in product specifications of each model.



4.3 Indicator

By checking the indicator status, you can learn about the running status of the IdeaHub in a timely manner and ensure the normal running of it and its peripheral devices. **Table 4-2** describes the indicator status.

4.4 Touch

The HUAWEI Touch, an optional 10-inch touch panel, is used for operating the IdeaHub. The Touch provides a user-friendly UI where you can easily use conference functions such as calling a participant and controlling a conference through several taps.

5 Functions and Features

5.1 Ultra-HD Video

The IdeaHub uses H.265 as the encoding and decoding protocol for both video and content, combined with Huawei proprietary Video Motion Enhancement (VME), to deliver 1080p 30 fps video and 4K data conferencing experience.

4K provides the incredible clarity and lifelike detail, with a resolution four times that of 1080p, on a larger screen.




Figure 5-1 H.265 4K ultra-HD video

5.2 Hi-Fi Audio

- Acoustic Echo Cancellation (AEC), Automatic Noise Suppression (ANS), Automatic Gain Control (AGC), VoiceClear, AudioEnhancer, and lip synchronization are supported.
- Opus-related technologies are adopted, including Forward Error Correction (FEC), Backward Error Correction (BEC), Packet Loss Concealment (PLC), Net Automatic Transfer-Enhancement (netATE), and Audio Jitter Buffer (AJB).
- Built-in microphone array, 8-meter sound pickup, and external microphone array for extending pickup distance, to deliver clear, crisp audio of speakers

5.3 Acoustic Baffle

The IdeaHub supports acoustic baffle, a technology that allows users to define the sound pickup scope to eliminate the impact of ambient noise, creating a personal conference space with AI.

5.4 Smart Projection

The IdeaHub supports wired and wireless projection, allowing you to easily share audios, videos, images, and files on your mobile device or PC. In addition, it supports reverse control and remote annotation, making projection and information interaction simple and efficient.

Wired Projection

The IdeaHub supports desktop sharing and plug-and-share. If no site is sharing a presentation during a conference, you can share your PC desktop without additional operations. If a site is sharing a presentation in the conference, you need to share the presentation with the remote site as prompted.

Wireless Projection

Wireless projection frees you from complex cable connections and allows you to share your PC and mobile device desktops. When multiple wireless projection sources are connected, you can switch between them. The IdeaHub supports a maximum of 20 projection sources.




Figure 5-3 Wireless projection

- Using the IdeaShare Android client, you can share the screen of a mobile device.
- Using the IdeaShare PC client, you can share your computer desktop with others
- Using IdeaShare Key, you can share your computer desktop in one click.

Reverse Control

When you use wired or wireless projection, you can reversely control the computer desktop on the IdeaHub by performing tap, drag, and double-tap operations on the touchscreen. You can also edit documents on the PC when an external keyboard is connected to the IdeaHub or the soft keyboard is enabled on the PC. When a PPT is in projection mode on the PC, you can turn pages or end the projection using the touchscreen.

When using the IdeaShare mobile client to share content, you can stop sharing using the touchscreen.

5.5 Intelligent Tracking

Voice Tracking

The IdeaHub Pro supports voice tracking. It uses voice tracking and face detection algorithms to detect and locate the sound source, automatically displays the close-up image of the speaker, and keeps the speaker in the middle of the image.


■ NOTE

Only the IdeaHub Pro supports the voice tracking function.

AutoFrame

With the AutoFrame function, the IdeaHub automatically adjusts its camera based on the number and positions of attendees to take the optimal panoramic view.

5.6 On-Screen Name Tags

With face detection and recognition technologies, the IdeaHub automatically identifies attendees and adds on-screen name tags of attendees to the video for easy communication.

□ NOTE

On-screen name tags are supported only in the CloudVC on-premises network scenario.

5.7 Facial Recognition Sign-In

With face detection and recognition technologies, the IdeaHub identifies an attendee before or during a conference and reports the attendee information to the server for sign-in, implementing auto sign-in.

You can view conference sign-in information on the touchscreen and Touch.

□ NOTE

Facial recognition sign-in is supported only in the CloudVC on-premises network scenario.





The following facial recognition sign-in modes are provided. The auto sign-in is used by default.

• Background sign-in

The IdeaHub performs facial recognition sign-in in the background and does not display the sign-in window in full screen.

• Auto sign-in

The system automatically enables the full-screen sign-in once the sign-in starts. Then, the system automatically switches to background sign-in after the conference starts.

Full-screen sign-in
 The sign-in window is displayed in full screen.

5.8 Whiteboard Collaboration

The built-in whiteboard of the IdeaHub allows for collaboration between the local and far ends. Users can take away the meeting minutes by scanning QR codes with WeChat and the HUAWEI CLOUD Meeting client.

5.9 Multistream Conferencing

Multistream conferencing leverages Scalable Video Coding (SVC), with which the IdeaHub is responsible for video codec and continuous presence layout and the MCU (CloudMCU or VP9800 series MCU) only forwards video streams at different resolutions or frame rates. In this way, the workload is relieved, the latency is reduced, and access of mass IdeaHubs is made possible.

A maximum of four channels of video streams can be sent from the IdeaHub to the MCU (CloudMCU or VP9800 series MCU). The resolution ranges from 90p to 720p. A maximum of 16 channels of video streams can be forwarded from the MCU to each IdeaHub. The resolution depends on the actual bandwidth (maximum of 720p allowed).

5.10 Multiple Layouts

You can view the composite of video and content on one screen by adjusting the screen layout. In a data collaboration conference, video, content, and whiteboard can be simultaneously displayed on one screen.

The IdeaHub supports dual-screen display. Different images can be displayed on each display at the same time.

Non-Multistream Conferencing

The following layouts are available:

- Full screen
 - Video, content, or whiteboard is displayed in full-screen mode.
- Picture in Picture (PiP)

The PiP mode includes one full-screen video and a small window that can be located at any of the four corners. By default, the small window lies in the upper right corner. In a video conference, the small window size is about 1/16 of the full screen size.

• Picture out Picture (PoP)

Two or more panes are separately displayed on one screen.

Multistream Conferencing

The following layouts are available:

- Presenter view
 - When content sharing is in progress, shared content is displayed in the large pane.
 - When no content is shared, the large pane presents the speaker. A speaker can be configured to permanently stay in the large pane.
 - If a user chooses to broadcast or view a participant, the participant will be presented in the large pane.

PiP view

- When content sharing is in progress, shared content is displayed in the large pane. The small pane presents video of the broadcast participant, speaker, and other participants, in descending order of priority.
- When no content is shared, the large pane presents the speaker. A speaker can be configured to permanently stay in the large pane. Video of other participants is displayed in the small pane.
- If a user chooses to broadcast or view a participant, the participant will be presented in the large pane. The small pane presents shared content or video of other participants.

Gallery view

Video of participants and shared content are displayed in panes (16 at most) equivalently.

5.11 Dual-Screen

With the dual-screen clone or switching function, the IdeaHub allows you to clone the content on its screen to another screen or switch the content displayed on the two screens simply through GUI operations without modifying the cable connection and configuration.

5.12 Address Book

The address book stores participant information, with which you can directly start a meeting. The IdeaHub can obtain a participant's information from the corporate directory or LDAP server.

The administrator can perform the following operations:

- Query, edit, and delete contacts on the web interface, sort contacts, add participants to the address book, and add groups. Contacts that are found from the LDAP address book server can be saved to the local address book, but those found from the corporate directory cannot.
- Update contacts in the local address book in batches by importing/exporting their information into/from the web interface.
- Initiate calls to participants or invite new participants to join a meeting on the Touch, touchscreen, or web interface.

5.13 Wireless Connections

The IdeaHub supports 2 x 2 Wi-Fi technology (that is, 2-channel input and 2-channel output of Wi-Fi data), dual antennas, and dual bands (2.4 GHz and 5 GHz). The IdeaHub can serve as a Wi-Fi hotspot and connect to a Wi-Fi network as a client at the same time.

If the IdeaHub is configured as a client, it automatically detects and connects to Wi-Fi networks. You can set the client IP address in DHCP or static mode. This function applies to the scenarios in which no wired network is available and you need to connect the IdeaHub to the network through Wi-Fi.

When the IdeaHub has its Wi-Fi hotspot enabled, it can serve as a hotspot for connecting other devices (such as a PC) to Wi-Fi.

5.14 Strong Network Adaptability and High Security

- Leading technologies, including Super Error Concealment (SEC), Hybrid Automatic Repeat Request (HARQ) retransmission, and automatic deceleration, are utilized to deliver clear and smooth service even when the video packet loss rate reaches 30% and audio packet loss rate reaches 80%.
- The Opus high-quality codec, Net Automatic Transfer-enhancement (netATE), and Audio Jitter Buffer (AJB) are supported to reduce the packet loss rate and improve audio quality.
- Bandwidth sharing is supported among video and content in a conference.
 This feature improves network utilization and delivers smooth HD video images.
- Huawei's proprietary Intelligent Rate Control (IRC) technology is used to automatically detect network service bandwidth occupation and intelligently select the optimal resolution based on the bandwidth to ensure high conference quality.
- Various encryption measures are taken, such as SRTP, TLS, and HTTPS, ensuring secure and stable running of the video conferencing system.

5.15 Joining or Initiating a Meeting

Joining a Meeting

You can join a meeting from the schedule or by entering the meeting ID. Alternatively, you can scan the QR code with the HUAWEI CLOUD Meeting client.

Initiating a Meeting

A meeting can be arranged using any of the following methods:

- Starting a meeting instantly
 - You can start a meeting instantly through the Virtual Meeting Room (VMR) in just one click or through SiteCall. This function is applicable to the scenario where you have not scheduled any meetings but need to start a meeting right now. After a meeting is created, you can directly invite participants to the meeting by calling them. Alternatively, send the meeting ID to participants. They can then dial the meeting ID to join the meeting.
- Initiating a multipoint meeting
 Select multiple contacts to initiate a meeting and set parameters, such as the chair password and whether to encrypt the meeting.
- Initiating a point-to-point (P2P) meeting
 You can directly call a participant number or IP address, or search for or select a participant in the contact list to call.

5.16 Conference Control

Both the chair participant and other participants in a conference can control the conference, but the operations they can perform are different, as listed in **Table 5-2**.







Figure 5-13 Conference control on the web interface

The IdeaHub supports releasing various types of information on the home page, including corporate culture, operation instructions, administrative services, and welcome speeches. Content can be managed by level and can be flexibly defined based on application scenarios.

The IdeaHub supports the HiBoard welcome page. Three welcome page templates are available and users can customize the content and font of the welcome page.


Figure 5-15 HiBoard



5.19 Apps

The IdeaHub has common office apps pre-installed. You can customize apps on the home page.

For large enterprises, the management platform can push existing web applications to the IdeaHub for unified application distribution and management.





5.20 Globalization

The IdeaHub touchscreen, Touch and web interface support multiple languages and time zone settings. If some countries in the selected time zone use daylight saving time (DST), the IdeaHub automatically enables DST and changes its clock to comply with DST.

All GUIs of the IdeaHub support the following languages: Simplified Chinese, Traditional Chinese, English, Spanish (Europe), French, Russian, Japanese, German, and Portuguese (Brazil).

5.21 OAM

5.21.1 Automatic Configuration

Zero Configuration

The IdeaHub can automatically obtain the server type through the DHCP server. To complete quick configuration, you only need to set the IP address and server IP address of the IdeaHub or enter the activation code.

Configuration Using a USB Device

You can obtain a USB device with a configuration file from the agent or carrier, and then import the configuration file to the IdeaHub through the USB device. In this way, the configuration is automatically completed at a high efficiency.

5.21.2 Customizing a Boot Screen and Changing a Wallpaper

- You can replace the customized boot screen and logo using the upgrade tool to meet personalized requirements.
- You can change the wallpaper on the Touch, web interface, and touchscreen.

5.22 APIs for Third-Party Integration

The IdeaHub provides HTTP-compliant third-party APIs to implement various functions, including login authentication, participant calling, participant query, conference control, address book management, system configuration, and status parameter query, as shown in Figure 5-17.

Users can choose necessary APIs based on their actual needs to develop required functions and integrate functions of the IdeaHub into other products or applications.

6 Security and Reliability

6.1 Operating System Security

Security maintenance for the system layer ensures that the operating system runs smoothly and also supports stable services at the application layer. The touchscreen uses a customized Android operating system, which delivers enhanced security and immunity to viruses.

6.2 Network Layer Security

The network layer security policies for the CloudVC on-premises network are as follows:

- The IdeaHub, SMC, and MCU are deployed in the trusted zone, isolated from the Demilitarized Zone (DMZ) and the untrusted zone. Furthermore, firewalls are deployed for security domain division and access control.
- The IdeaHub in the untrusted zone communicates with NEs in the trusted zone through the Switch Center (SC) in the DMZ.

6.3 Firewall Technology (NAT)

The firewall protects your IP network by separating the internal and external network communication data. Using Network Address Translation (NAT) technology and signaling exchange between public network protocols and private network protocols, the firewall enables participants on local area networks (LANs) in different places to use video conferences, implementing zero-distance communication through video conferences. With NAT, a device on a LAN is allocated a dedicated internal IP address that uniquely identifies the device on the LAN, and the device uses an external IP address to communicate with external devices. Through NAT mapping, multiple internal IP addresses are mapped to one external IP address. NAT mapping not only reduces the number of IP addresses that are needed for users on a private network to access the Internet, but also enhances the security of the private network.

6.4 Traversal Between Public and Private Networks

The media latching and standard H.460 traversal technology are used to set up secure video call connections between public and private networks and between private networks through the firewall.

6.5 Email Security

To ensure the security of email accounts and sent emails, the STARTTLS protocol is used by default to authenticate the mail server and send encrypted emails.

6.6 Web Request Authentication

- When a user requests access to a specified web page or submits a Servlet request, the IdeaHub checks whether the user's session identifier is valid and whether the user is authorized to perform the operation.
- The server implements the final authentication on the user.
- Before transmitting user-generated data to clients, the server verifies the data and encodes it using HyperText Markup Language (HTML) to prevent malicious code injection and cross-site scripting attacks.
- Web security software is used to scan the web server and applications to ensure that there are no high-risk vulnerabilities.

6.7 Protocol Anti-Attack Measures

 The communication matrix is provided in the product documentation. Do not enable the services and ports that are not described in the communication matrix.

The communication matrix contains the following information:

- Open ports
- Transport layer protocols used by the ports
- NEs that use the ports to communicate with peer NEs
- Application layer protocols used by the ports and description of the services at the application layer
- Whether services at the application layer can be disabled
- Authentication modes adopted by the ports
- Port functions (such as data traffic control)
- To ensure the security and stability of the video conferencing system, the IdeaHub utilizes multiple encryption measures, including H.235 (for encryption of media and signaling streams), SRTP, TLS, and HTTPS.
- For network management, the IdeaHub supports the SNMP v3 protocol, which features higher adaptability and security. User names and passwords are needed to connect the network management system to the IdeaHub.
- Robustness testing tools are used to scan protocols to ensure that there are no high-risk vulnerabilities.

• By default, the LDAP over SSL (LDAPS) protocol is used to encrypt the address book, ensuring data integrity and preventing data from being stolen.

6.8 Protection of Sensitive Data

- The log, diagnostics, debug, and alarm information do not contain sensitive data such as passwords and ciphering contexts. If sensitive data is included, it is displayed as "***".
- Sensitive data is transmitted only through secure channels or after being encrypted.
- In the collaborative application scenario, the uPortal uses the root certificate for authentication through HTTPS to protect sensitive information such as accounts and passwords.
- The IdeaHub checks the complexity of passwords. When a password is being entered, each stroke is displayed as "." or "*", and the entered password cannot be copied.
- Only standard encryption algorithms and key negotiation mechanisms are used. Proprietary algorithms are not allowed.

6.9 Facial Recognition Privacy Protection

The facial recognition sign-in and on-screen name tag functions of the IdeaHub submit facial data to the server for recognition, but do not save the facial data. After leaving a conference or being restarted, the IdeaHub deletes the facial image obtained from the server to ensure that the facial image is used only for facial recognition sign-in.

6.10 System Management and Maintenance Security

- Software packages (including patches) are released only after they are scanned by at least five types of mainstream antivirus software and no issues are detected. In special cases, explanation is provided for alarms.
- All user operations and system exceptions are logged.
- A two-level certificate chain is supported to ensure the transmission security of confidential data.

6.11 Security Design

- The non-metal parts of the exterior use the V1 flame retardant (FR) materials.
- The component security design meets the requirements of the nine countries in the EU, North America, Australia, Canada, and the Middle East, as well as China. The components of mechanical parts comply with the EU Machinery Directive 2006/42/EC.
- Labels and security tips are used.

6.12 Disaster Recovery

The IdeaHub can simultaneously connect to the active and standby corporate directories or SCs for disaster recovery (DR). When the active corporate directory or SC is faulty, the IdeaHub automatically switches to the standby corporate directory or SC to continue providing services.

6.13 Secure Startup

The IdeaHub supports secure startup. During the startup process, the integrity of the U-Boot, kernel, and application software is verified level by level to ensure that all software running on the IdeaHub is valid, thereby ensuring reliable and secure running of the IdeaHub.

Operations and Maintenance

7.1 GUIS

7.1.1 Touchscreen

The IdeaHub uses a new touchable whiteboard collaboration system. You can tap the icon or enable the intelligent voice assistant to perform operations. The system provides the following main functions:

- Projection
- Whiteboard collaboration and sharing
- Call and conference control
- Microphone, camera, and speaker control
- System Settings
- Device diagnostics and wallpaper change
- Application management
- File management

7.1.2 Touch UI

The Touch is optional for the IdeaHub and provides a 10-inch GUI touchscreen. Users can tap icons on it to perform operations. It provides the following functions:

- System configuration
- Call and conference control
- Microphone, speaker, and camera control
- Device diagnostics and wallpaper change

7.1.3 Web Interface

The IdeaHub can be remotely operated by the administrator from its web interface. The web interface allows simultaneous operations from up to 10 users through the same account. However, only the last operation takes effect.

The main functions available on the web interface are as follows:


- Conference

7.1.4 IdeaShare UI

The IdeaShare is a wireless projection client designed for the IdeaHub. It can be installed on a PC or Android mobile device. A maximum of 20 users can be connected at the same time. When one participant is sharing presentation, other participants are still allowed to start sharing, but the existing presentation session will be dropped.

The IdeaShare wireless projection client integrates the remote control function, allowing users to mute or unmute the microphone, turn on or off the camera, adjust the volume, and end a meeting.

Figure 7-1 IdeaShare app UI






Figure 7-2 IdeaShare PC client UI

7.2 Maintenance and Upgrade

7.2.1 Log Management

The IdeaHub records logs about user operations and system exceptions, helping the administrator maintain the system and locate faults.

Logs are stored as files. On the IdeaHub web interface, the administrator can query, export, or delete all logs.

7.2.2 Device Diagnosis

The IdeaHub can detect the hardware running status, network connections, audio input/output, video input/output, common parameter settings, and server registration status to help users locate faults.

7.2.3 Inspection

SMC can inspect the IdeaHub:

- Check the status of IP lines.
- Check the system software version.
- Check the system performance, including the temperature status.
- Check the H.323 and SIP registration status.
- Check the content source connection status and input port settings.
- Check the video input cable connection status and video input port settings.
- Continue inspection after the IdeaHub restarts or ends a call.
- Receive the inspection status and result.

7.2.4 Upgrade

You can upgrade the IdeaHub to fix vulnerabilities and use new functions. The following upgrade methods are supported:

- You can manually upgrade the IdeaHub using the upgrade tool or web interface.
- The IdeaHub can be first restored to factory defaults and then upgraded.
- You can upgrade the IdeaHub from the SMC or HUAWEI CLOUD.
- The IdeaHub supports silent upgrade mode, in which the IdeaHub is upgraded at a scheduled time without affecting services.
- The IdeaHub can be upgraded in batches.
- The IdeaHub upgrade can be paused and resumed.
